FROM ST MARY'S RECTORY:



"The shepherds went back, singing praises to God for all they had heard and seen." Luke 2.20

When the angels break out in song it is hard not to join in or just sing in that excitable, joyful way, by way of imitation. Benjamin Britten was always sourcing poems or folk tales and putting his own musical genius and stamp on them to bring the texts to life...and to keep us in tune with heaven touching earth. The story and music of Christmas is very much still alive.

If you have been to as many school nativities as I have, or traditional carol services, you can sometimes come away though, feeling they could be boosted by a 'new slant' or

at least some new energy. Only recently I came across a beautiful carol from a hymn writer I had never heard of, Thomas Troeger. It is called 'The Sheep Stood Stunned in Sudden Light'. Our creative Organist at St Mary's has suggested that it will go well to the tune, 'O Waly, Waly', from a Somerset folk song. Sarah is right.

I am not sure if the 'premiere' will be heard at one of our Carol services first or, at our Mass for Midnight – you will have to wait and see! But here's a 'taster' from just two of the verses:

"This night, O God, again we hear Your hidden ocean drawing near, Again we sense through Jesus' birth The sea of grace that circles earth.

Through faith we'll hear the angels' song, And though the dark be deep and long, We'll bravely live, for by our side Is Christ who came on heaven' tide."

At a time of such tragic news of suffering, destruction and death in Gaza and the 'Holy Land' it seems inappropriate to recall our natural desire to sing, and yet there are surely songs of lament we can recall or rediscover which capture our sorrow that Christ's 'home' has again, become a battlefield. Perhaps we need to remember Christ came to us homeless and poor in order that we may still discover the treasures of his friendship, love and mercy. He came to give us a voice to become messengers of peace and goodwill. So light a candle in the darkness that we may still shine as lights in the world, hoping beyond hope.

ST. MARY'S HOUSE - AT THE HEART OF THE MARKET HILL

For centuries the building, known now as St Mary's House, has been an integral part of Market Hill. Previously The White Horse public house, which traded also as The George and The White Hart, is known to have had Samuel

Nevil as landlord in 1739. It ceased to be a pub in



1907, eventually to house our vergers and become the centre of our parish and community activities.

After formal consultations with congregation members and the other churches in the town, about a



decade ago ambitious plans

were developed for updating the building to create more welcoming spaces for the parish, the wider community of Woodbridge and further afield. With sustained effort in the intervening years, more consultations and surveys of our complex site have been undertaken, so that detailed architectural drawings are in place for further discussions with the local authority.

Given its current leaky roofs, inefficient heating and lighting, ancient toilets, varied levels and poor accessibility, serious action to preserve and modernise the building is now required. Together with new plans to install a toilet in the church and to enhance access to both buildings, energies for improvement have gathered pace in recent years, with the aim that each building can meet the needs of all, well into the 21st Century! The old cellar and dray skids remain as a reminder of past usage.

ST MARY'S 'SOUP & SARNIES'

Conscious that January and February are typically cold, and often lonely, months of the year, we would like to put on a simple soup & sandwich lunch every Friday from

THE RETURN OF CARLOW'S DOLE - A former owner of the Bull Inn, George Carlow, who died in 1738, had a tomb built for himself in the hotel's garden! He left a will stipulating that the Rector and Churchwardens of St Mary's "shall and do yearly, and every year for ever after my decease, give and distribute twenty shillings-worth of good wheaten bread at, or upon, the said tomb, on the second day of February, commonly called Candlemas."

Fr Nigel is very much looking forward to reviving this ancient ceremony, with a little help from proprietors David and Sarah Clarke, some kind bread makers, and a class or two from St Mary's CE Primary.

FRIENDSHIP BOXES SENT TO UKRAINE

Forty-five Friendship Boxes intended for children in the Lviv area of Ukraine were dispatched to Ukraine on November 2 in response to the Woodbridge Rotary Appeal co-ordinated by Ashley Meyer. New customs regulations operating in Ukraine means it's unlikely the boxes will get there before Christmas but they will make nice New Year presents. The four Primary Schools in Woodbridge and Melton responded very generously to the Appeal:

Melton Primary School, Woodbridge Primary School, Kyson Primary School and St Mary's C E Primary School

Wotsits Shop in the Thoroughfare donated many items to the Appeal and provided a box in their shop for members of the public to contribute, and Woodbridge Methodist Church provided a room and help sorting and packing the boxes.

ORGAN RECITAL - on Sunday, 19th November, we were treated to a wonderful organ recital given by Tim Patient, Director of Music at the Church of St Peter and St Paul in Eye. The recital was arranged by The Friends of St Marys to celebrate the recent 'swell box' work carried out on the organ. RE-LIGHTING ST MARYS CHURCH

Following a successful trial in the Epiphany Chapel, St Mary's Churchwardens and Building Maintenance volunteers will be delivering a project to re-light the church with up-to-date LED lamps. These will look very similar, but will more than halve our energy consumption from around 1kW with all chandeliers lit, to less than 500w. The work will initially replace all 60 chandelier lamps, and will continue to review and upgrade the spotlights and up-lights where this is possible.


