#### CARING FOR GOD'S ACRE

Warm Greetings All, to (nearly) everyone in Woodbridge!



Only recently, I said publicly, introducing our 10am Sunday Family Parish Eucharist at St Mary's: "We gather to worship the God who is beyond our understanding, yet as close to us as the air that we breathe. Let us rejoice that the creator of the universe is also the Saviour of the world and the guiding Spirit of our lives."

You will read in these pages about our recent 'Churches Count on Nature' Week which was inspired by two Eco-charities involving over 400 Churchyards nationally.

I am delighted to report that we welcomed three separate classes from our CE Primary School, our 'B Club' Junior Church, and our

uniformed organizations at St Mary's – along with a host of keen and intrepid adult explorers - who have sent off their recordings of all the amazing biodiverse habitat spotted in our own churchyard 'haven'. Insects, trees, plants and shrubs, and occasional 'flying' creatures were all noted and pictured on particular days with great excitement and, not a little, new discovery and learning. Fantastic!

Less encouraging, (after our Government was the only G7 country to cut overseas aid before their meeting in St Ives), is whether the time has come for as many of us as possible to 'think globally and act locally' when it comes to the urgency of climate change also and our response to cherish and protect the beautiful environment and 'green' our God has made.

When I joined the RSPB and Woodland Trust a few years back, I knew that local partnerships were more important than ever to overturn the empty promises of so much political rhetoric. Which is why 'Churches Together' are planning (with your help) a 'Climate Sunday' Event in Kingston Field with keynote speakers on the afternoon of Sunday, 19<sup>th</sup> September. It would be great if as many local organizations (regardless of creed) like Transition Woodbridge, Suffolk Wildlife Trust, Fairtrade, Woodbridge Swifts, you name it, could be represented and bring their own imaginative and colourful stalls? We probably need some TikTok dance volunteers as well, and some trumpets or, Magic Flute?

We need to build up a united front and 'call' for justice before COP26 in Glasgow for what are undoubtedly the most urgent international and moral issues of our age. In our neighbouring Diocese of Norwich, the Bishop is the new C of E Lead on our Environmental programme and, apparently, every new confirmation candidate receives a hazel tree to plant as a nod to Mother Julian of Norwich, the 14<sup>th</sup> century mystic, who reflected on the glory of God as she held a hazelnut in the palm of her hand. That has to be encouraging 700 years on, but the clock is ticking away faster now, and we must face the music – or do I mean the planting?

There is no Plan(et) 'B' so let's start to make and grow the pressing links between human and divine - and save our sacred world! **Fr Nigel** 

#### ON THE MOVE AND UPDATES!

URGENT WORKS will soon be carried out to the walls and end piers of the main entrance to St. Mary's Churchyard in Church Street. Due to the presence of a large plane tree on the eastern boundary, with a large and encroaching root structure, this has now become an issue of safety to the public.

We are grateful for the advice and funding from East Suffolk Council to dismantle the tops of both 'white' piers, the red pier and associated railing panels, down to the level of the coping stones. After this emergency work is completed, phase 2 will see the rebuilding of the pillars in a new position and the historic metal gates restored and rehung. 

#### GOD'S ACRE

Old churchyards with history, are best left untrimmed and wild. These areas of quietness - home for a variety of flora and fauna – delight us with their beauty, inspire us to write, paint, construct poems and compose music. And to sit in peace, allowing divine communication . In such places there is a good collection of flora – primroses, violets, buttercups and celandines, red deadnettle, daisy. Wordsworth, enamoured of this flower wrote several Daisy poems, including 'To that same flower.'

Common and traditionally found in churchyards - the Yew, heavy, green with red berries – food and shelter for the birds. Tombstones, often encrusted with moss and lichen, are home to all manner of insects which hide where stone meets earth. Snails banded, and slugs heavy, black, slide through vegetation, sought by blackbirds and thrushes. On church walls we might find more mosses, and perhaps the flower, Pellitory-of-the-wall. Ivy too, climbs walls, offering berries beloved by wood pigeons. Grasshoppers, a large variety of aphids, worms buried in the earth. Ladybirds can be spotted in low cover! Foxes, hedgehogs, will seek sustenance at night. Owls too hunt nocturnally. By day a variety of birds seek their lunch – robins, flycatchers, woodpeckers.

Come and help discover who and what lives in, and shares, our churchyard. Help to count and to care for God's acre – with dignity, remembering those who rest therein. **Michael Stagg**
