THE CHURCH CLOCK

The Church Recording Society is currently recording in St Mary's. Made up from members of the three local Arts Society groups, the volunteers meticulously describe, measure, photograph and research the items inside the church. About two thousand of these records have been completed across the UK with

copies sent to local record offices, the Church Authorities and the Victoria and Albert Museum.

Did you know there is a turret clock in St Mary's? Possibly not, as it is a clock with no faces, so although it can chime the hours and quarters there are no dials as visual aids. There is also a Carillon in the bell chamber of the tower which at one time would play a selection of tunes, but that is a story for another day. The clock has recently had its first inspection by the group. It is to be found in its own three sided



cupboard in the ringing chamber of the Tower. The pendulum and weights have their own separate cupboards, all constructed to not very effectively protect the moving parts from dust.

For the more technically minded among you, the clock movement has three trains in a side by side birdcage frame. These type of frames came into use about 1670 and were used until the end of the 18th century. The St Mary's clock is thought to date from around 1715. It is not currently working but there is a printed sign displayed below the clock movement cupboard which reads,

'St Mary's has a clock. It never had a face but rang the quarters and hours. The mechanism is still in working order but has not been used for 50 years.'

The present Bell Captain recalls that the sign was printed by Dick Rice, a printer and bell ringer who died in 1994. When last going, the clock had an accuracy of one minute per week. Once the clock has been properly recorded and checked by the Diocesan Bell Advisor its details will be sent to the Turret Clock Section of the Antiquarian Horological Society.

If any readers are interested in the work of the Church Recorders, we are usually in the church between 10.00am and 12noon on the second and fourth Mondays of the month.

CAR IDLING

We can all help reduce air pollution in and around Woodbridge by turning off our car engines when stationary - for example, when waiting for children outside schools. And we can save money too!

According to the RAC motoring organisation, idling increases the amount of exhaust fumes in the air. These fumes contain a number of harmful gasses, such as carbon dioxide (which is bad for the environment and contributes towards climate change), and others including nitrogen dioxide, carbon monoxide and hydrocarbons which are linked to asthma and other lung diseases. There are also particulates which are bad for our lungs – especially for children. The Royal College of Physicians estimate 40,000 deaths a year in the UK are linked to air pollution, with engine idling contributing to this.

The average car uses over two litres of fuel an hour when idling which at current prices equals nearly \$4.



It is also illegal under Section 42 of the Road Traffic Act 1988. The act enforces Rule 123 of the Highway Code, which states: "You must not leave a vehicle's engine running unnecessarily while that vehicle is stationary on a public road".

It seems that there is a belief that you can park on a yellow line if you leave the engine running. This is a complete myth – you can get a parking ticket and possibly fined for idling as well!

With modern engines and batteries, idling makes for MORE wear on the engine (not less, as is sometimes thought). And your heater or aircon will run perfectly well without the engine on for about half an hour!

So when waiting in your car or popping into a shop – save money, save the environment, save health, and **SWITCH IT OFF!**
