MARY, MOTHER OF GOD, PRAY FOR US!



The conflicts and controversies of Reformation England are still alive in the Church of England, centuries later! Even though the majority of Suffolk Churches are named after 'Saint' Mary, she continues to be largely side-lined by our prejudice or 'rejection' that she is a (dead) Roman Catholic!

In the ancient and beautiful porch of St Mary's, Great Bealings, you can see the empty plinth above where once she would have stood proud, welcoming us all in. And we know how Cromwell's troops vandalised and abused her memory as if somehow her 'Magnificat' should be erased or even worse, forgotten completely. In Playford, St Mary, you can look up to a new and modern sculpture and 'replacement' which, I believe, is

a wonderful and important spiritual and theological legacy to keep, and treasure

Her 'revival' at the different shrines of England's 'Holy Nazareth' in Walsingham tell a similar and contemporary story: of candles lit, prayers answered, pilgrimages enjoyed, and shared (ecumenical) faith renewed.

Mary was and always will be, the 'God-bearer' (theotokos in Greek) who suffered much and sacrificed much more: to not only reveal the infant Jesus but to see him grow up and inspire so many, to see him cruelly killed, and to literally hold him after his body came down from the cross...hence the pictures and icons of the Pieta, Our Lady of Sorrows... until the dawn of the Resurrection broke, when Christ 'burst from the tomb.' We only have a very limited 'biblical biography' but do we really need to know any more? Mary was no ordinary Saint but so much more...

Which is why she has more 'Feast Days' than anyone else in the worship and tradition of so many Churches across the world. We always need to revisit her vocation and calling and sacrifice if we are to ever imitate or come closer to her binding relationship with Her Son and the incarnate love of God offered to each of us, and all whom we love. So if you are a child at St Mary's primary school, be proud of the name and her meaning for us. Ditto, for our local churches who bear her name also, and walk in her ways of commitment and devotion to Our Lord.

For those of you who, like me, love the sculptures of Elizabeth Frink, see her figure of Mary 'striding' confidently, purposefully, in front of Salisbury Cathedral; this is no coy, submissive, oppressed woman but 'modern' in the best sense – representing empowerment, freedom, and inner strength – mental, physical, spiritual.

For those of you who, like me, love the haunting and lyrical Greek Orthodox music of John Tavener, his 'Hymn to the Mother of God' surely brings even the disbelieving to their knees as he concludes so triumphantly:

"In You, O Woman full of Grace, all creation rejoices."

We really do need to demystify and relearn the radical message of Mary's everyday 'Magnificat' message for Woodbridge, and be inspired by the wider world she embraces and intercedes for. Her beautiful statue is 'out in the open' at our Parish Church for all to see, and no longer hidden away in the tiny Epiphany Chapel. Candles are indeed lit in front of her every day, praise be!

We shall keep the Feast of 'The Annunciation to Mary' (Lady Day) at Woodbridge on Sunday, 2nd July and 'The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary' will be celebrated in Great Bealings on Sunday, 10th September. These are our special, annual HOLY-days, where feasting and fellowship afterwards are encouraged and shared. Please join us and let's be open to God's visiting and speaking to us in however new, surprising or joyful of ways.

Fairtrade has always been important to many people in Woodbridge. A small band of determined folk are coming together in a bid to register Woodbridge as a Fairtrade Community once more.



PLANNING PERMISSION and, a separate Diocesan Faculty, have now been applied for by East Suffolk County Council to restore, renew and move forward the brick piers and wrought iron gates at the top of Church Street, as you enter the churchyard. We are very grateful to Laura Hack for doing all the detailed liaison with Fr Nigel and a host of advisors as well as, arranging funding some 12 years after our original application - when the roots of the large plane tree first began to make the entrance unstable.







BEAUTIFUL BATS! These are protected too so we have recently put up a bat box on the 'listed' Cedar Tree at the rear of St Mary's House. Please tell us if you see any nightly visits? We've also put up two bird nesting boxes and wait patiently for blue-tits to investigate them. Our bird feeding 'station' has been moved to a more accessible position.

CORONATION DAY - RINGING THE BELLS

On 6 May, twelve bellringers climbed the tower to join with churches across the UK ringing for the King's Coronation. They each have an official badge to prove it!

TO THE PARTY OF TH

Bruce Wakefield, our Tower Captain is really proud to be able to say he's rung for the coronations of both Queen Elizabeth II and King Charles III. Bruce comes from



a very large ringing family and it's also highly likely that his father, as well as ringing for the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in 1953 would have also rung for the coronation of King George VI in 1937, because then he was a member of a band of young men ringers in the village in Gloucestershire where he lived.

Bruce's daughter Alyson, and his granddaughters Willow and Poppy, who live in Cornwall are all bellringers and rang for the coronation too. The two girls also play in a brass band that is frequently called upon to take part in special events, and they found themselves playing for other coronation-related events in Cornwall.

His son Paul learnt to ring, but the church he and his family attend in Colchester does not have bells, so he no longer regularly rings - although on rare occasions he's been persuaded to ring here in Woodbridge when visiting for special events.

Bruce's two brothers, one who lives in Lincolnshire and the other who lives in Staffordshire also rang for the Coronation of King Charles III in their respective churches.

CORONATION DAY - WATCHING THE CEREMONY

Around sixty people watched the coronation on the big screen in church. Visiting tourists and local people joined in and it was a great way to celebrate the occasion, in the company of others, and with Prosecco and 'jolly nice' refreshments provided by the pop-up 'Royal Cafe' at the west end. The church looked wonderfully decorated with beautiful flowers.



CORONATION DAY - SINGING IN THE ALBERT HALL

Two of our choir members, Patricia Ford and Annie Lines were given a fantastic opportunity to sing on Coronation Day at the special concert in the Royal Albert Hall.

"The participation and preparation was organised locally through Cantus Firmus by Richard Hubbard, who is well known in the town, through St Mary's Church and Woodbridge School, and who did a splendid and faultless job.

The choir from Cantus Firmus numbered 77 and we became a massed choir from other churches and choirs across the uk, numbering 320 in total. In addition to the choir, there was an All Souls 120 piece orchestra conducted by Michael Andrews, a charismatic and interesting individual who only added to the amazing ambience of the evening.

There were other performers, The Kingdom Choir and Joanne Lunn, a renowned Baroque Soprano, adding beauty and professionalism to the concert.

Prior to the event, we had to attend a number of practice sessions which were great fun and a lot of laughing was involved culminating in the concert itself. To be in the great Royal Albert Hall is wonderful but to sing in a choir there is surely a privilege and we are both so grateful to have been given that honour on such an auspicious day."
