23 Carol of the Atonement

Soul of Jesu, make me whole, meek and humble make my soul; Thou most sinless Soul divine, cleanse this sinful soul of mine; Hallow this my contrite heart, purify my inmost part; Soul of Jesu, strengthen me; *Miserere Domine*. Jesu, by that wondrous power of thine awful Passion hour, By the unimagined woe mortal man may never know; By the sins upon thee laid, by the ransom thou hast paid, By thy suffering comfort me; *Miserere Domine*. Jesu, by thy bitter death, by thy last expiring breath, Grant me thine eternal life purchased by that moral strife; Thou didst suffer death that I might not die eternally; By thy Passion quicken me; *Miserere Domini*.
